Man arrested with two girl foetuses

Gurgaon: A man who was trying to bury two girl foetuses was arrested on Monday. Police said the accused has been identified as Saifudeen. Police said the incident came to light after a resident of Silver Oaks in DLF Phase I spotted Saifudeen digging in the abandoned area next to the complex. The resident spotted the foetuses and caught hold of the accused. He was later handed over to police. ACP (DLF) Ramesh Pal said, "We received information from a passerby. The foetuses could be a case of legal abortion. However, it is too early to say anything. The foetuses have been sent for an autopsy. Once we get a report, we will investigate further." **ENS**

AAP in new row, now it's Vishwas

Woman wants leader to clarify he had no 'relationship' with her, Vishwas says it's dirty politics

THE DELHI Commission for Women (DCW) has sent AAP leader Kumar Vishwas a notice after a woman volunteer sent it a complaint, alleging that her family had asked her to leave the house because Vishwas was not publicly clarifying that he did not have a relationship with her. The complaint alleges that her name was being sullied in social media forums, and that Vishwas and his wife should both condemn the allegations against the complainant to prevent "her family from breaking apart because of the allegations".

DCW chairperson Barkha Singh said the complainant had first approached the commission 20 days ago. "We collected photos that were circulated in the media. Vishwas's wife has also made allegations and the complainant wants both of them to come out and accept that there is no such relationship. We are also not saying there is any relationship. But the fact that her family asked her to leave her house... made us summon Kumar Vishwas," she said.

Singh also said the victim has alleged that she tried to approach Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal and Vishwas, but the latter allegedly told her that "going to the police was futile".

Vishwas rejected the allegations and said when the woman volunteer came to him, he asked her to file a police complaint against those who were harassing her. "She registered complaint 15 days ago, but police have not taken any action yet. She had sent me an email asking 'what should I do now?' Thereafter, AAP's legal cell asked her to register an FIR in this regard," he said.

Vishwas said the BJP is running a false campaign to malign him. "We know the BJP and the Congress are in pain due to the results of Delhi polls. This is only being done to bring us down, but I will keep on fighting against such dirty politics. We are not going to be scared."

In a statement to the press, the woman volunteer, however, said that she saw no hand of any political party in the matter and only wanted "Vishwas to clarify publicly that there was no relationship between them". Leaders of the Aam Aadmi Party, however, alleged that video evi-

dence of her account to reporters showed that she was being prompted to say what she did.

Senior police officers said that the woman volunteer had indeed filed a complaint based on which an FIR was registered on April 29 at Nand Nagri police station. Senior officers said three people have been named in the FIR. "The victim, in her complaint, has said that some people have spread rumours that she has illicit relationship with AAP leader Kumar Vishwas on the social media and one of them even uploaded her photo on the internet as well," a police officer said.

The AAP backed their leader and instead attacked police for not acting "on the volunteer's complaint" and the media for misconstruing events.

"Please spare our families," Sanjay Singh said.

BJP state chief Satish Upadhyay attacked Kejriwal for "violating moral norms", while Congress women's wing chief Shobha Oza said, "When the woman approached him with her issue, saying her image is being tarnished and her marriage is falling apart, Kejriwal did nothing. Such apathetic and insensitive behaviour from him is very unfortunate."

Kejriwal wants to put media on 'janta ka trial'

THE OFTEN turbulent relationship between the Aam Aadmi Party and the media hit a new low after party chief Arvind Kejriwal on Sunday alleged that a big section of it was out to destroy his party and that the media should be put on a public trial.

"A very large section of the media has accepted 'supari' for finishing off AAP. There can be a public trial. There can be 8-10 spots in Delhi where we can collect a group of people and show the erroneous clip. That way we can start a 'janta ka trial'. If you see a channel shows a factually wrong report, take the channel's name and bring it forward," the chief minister said.

While Kejriwal's remarks riled the media, senior AAP leaders continued their attack as well. Speaking to reporters on Monday, AAP leader Sanjay Singh said that media reports on Kumar Vishwas's alleged relationship with an AAP volunteer were baseless.

"I request you with folded hands, please leave our families alone. Because of these baseless

reports which do not have any facts or evidence, our wives, our children, those who love us are unhappy. If you get any evidence, then run a story."

This is not the first time that AAP leaders have lashed out at the media or a section of it. As the party launched its Lok Sabha election campaign in Rohtak last year, Kejriwal alleged a nexus among big businesses, media houses and political parties.

Matters had come to a head last year when the Editor's Guild of India gave a notice to the AAP, denouncing the party for repeated attacks against the media — "attributing corrupt motives to the media" without providing enough evidence to back their claims.

After its landslide victory in Delhi, the AAP has become more strident.

"Before the elections, TV channels did not spare anything to ruin AAP. Even now, they are trying to discredit us in all possible ways. But, people are very smart. The more the media shows us in a negative light, the more support we will get. This time we won 67 seats and next time we may end up winning 70 seats," Kejriwal had said soon after the results.

Maken joins home buyers' protest

AFTER CONGRESS vice-president Rahul Gandhi met distressed home buyers in the NCR, Delhi unit chief Ajay Maken joined a protest of home buyers at Jantar Mantar on Monday, continuing the party's attempt to reach out to the middle-class and connect with the urban constituency.

Rahul had said that the meeting with the home buyers on Saturday had taught him that the middle-class, like the farmers, were suppressed in land

matters. He alleged that the Narendra Modi government had diluted provisions of the Real Estate Regulatory Authority Bill, making the legislation pro-builders from pro-buyers.

Maken, who was the former Housing and Urban Poverty Alleviation Minister, made a similar statement. "Around 20 amendments have been made in the Real Estate Bill which makes it pro-builder instead of pro-buyer. For instance, the carpet area... would be given according to the previous Bill," he said.

Maken said another provision has been added, according to which the builder can extend the deadline for compensation.

Upadhyay takes stock of crop loss in Outer Delhi

DELHI BJP chief Satish Upadhyay visited several villages and took stock of damage to crops, as part of an exercise dubbed by the party as 'Direct Dialogue' with farmers.

Upadhyay attacked the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) government for playing with the sentiments of farmers.

"After talking to farmers, I am of the view that they have suffered about 50 per cent crop loss and it is regrettable that the Delhi government is playing with the sentiments of the farmers instead of paying compensation. The Central government has already extended the limit of compensation but the state government, by announcing a slab for compensation, has let the farmers down. The government has also delayed the survey for assessing the damage," he said.

"Villagers complained about patwaris of the Delhi government demanding money for survey work. They also raised issues of unscheduled power cuts, the sorry state of affairs at health centres as well as shortage of buses and teachers in schools," he said.

Upadhyay visited Bakhtawarpur, Palla, Hamidpur, Narela, Bankner, Ghogha, Dariyapur, Qutubgarh, Punjab Khor, Gram Mazra and Begampur villages, among others. MP Ramesh Bidhuri, national secretary RPSingh, former MLA Kulwant Rana, general secretary Rekha Gupta and Ashish Sood were among those who accompanied him.
